The Assignment

You and your fellow investigators will sift through all of the case information and develop two theories - one “grounded” theory and one “outside the box” theory (one does need to keep an open mind to “other possibilities” after all).

You need to back up your claims with two types of sources:

- Sources related directly to the Dyatlov Pass case
- Sources **NOT** directly connected to it (Ex – Websites about weather conditions to support a theory that claims the hikers died due to a specific weather condition).

Guidelines

- 2 Theories per assignment
 - o 1 Grounded Theory
 - o 1 Outside the Box Theory
 - o Include both theories in the same paper

- Each theory will be 1-3 pages in length.

- At least three sources per theory
 - o Two sources directly related to Dyatlov Pass
 - o At least one source must not be directly related to Dyatlov Pass

- Internal Citation
- Work Cited Page
